TROPHY COMPETITION GUIDE

COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP

Qualifying round: Best scratch qualifier – CHALMERS ROSEBOWL (1977) Best net qualifying score – FENTON QUAICH (1950) - both can be won by same player. Match-play : 16 best Scratch scores qualify. Maximum 12 Handicap to qualify County Champion - DICKSON TROPHY (1934) Runner up - FARQUHARSON TROPHY

HANDICAP CHAMPIONSHIP

16 best Net qualify (changed from Bronze to Handicap in 2002) Handicap Champion - LAIRD TROPHY (1934) Runner up - SALVER (1989)

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS (1969 – donated by Mrs. D. Anderson)

One round of stroke play mid September.

To take part in the Champion of Champions, the player must be a member of ALCGA and current Champion of Club, County, Links or Nation or the present Champion of Champion (previous year's winner). A Junior may take part in the Champion of Champions if she is Junior County Champion, Champion of Club, County or Nation but **not** if she is a Club Junior Champion.

JUNIOR LADIES CHAMPIONSHIP (Thomson Trophy 1990)

Runner up Trophy donated by Dr. S. Tocher in 1996 Members under the age of 18 on 1st January in year of Championship, with silver division handicap (at entry closing date), who are members of a Club affiliated to ALCGA. Qualifying – one round stroke play. Best 4 scratch scores go through to matchplay stages but this may be increased to 8 depending on ability and numbers

THE ROYAL ALBERT QUAICH

(Presented by Kathleen Lackie in memory of Mrs. Cathy M. M. Lackie 2003) To be presented to the Junior with the best net aggregate score of the Junior Spring and Autumn Meetings.

AGGREGATE COMPETITION

Silver Division : best 3 Scratch Scores, best 3 Net Scores

Bronze Division : best 3 Scratch scores, best 3 net scores.

Differing SS scores for the various courses are taken into consideration. Aggregate of 3 best scores in same division. Players must have returned a score at 3 meetings. In the event of a tie, the prize to be shared. In the event of one person having both the best 3 scratch and best 3 handicap she wins the scratch, and the handicap is awarded to the runner-up in that section.

TOCHER SALVER (1976)

Trophy to be awarded for the best net score over the season, apart from Championship Qualifying. As several courses with different scratch scores will be involved, the player with the net score most below the SS will win.

1) Should this result in a tie, the score on the course with the highest SS will win.

2) If there is a tie on two or more courses with the same SS the player with the lower handicap will win.

3) If there is a tie on the same course, the player with the better inward half on handicap will win, or if necessary, the last 6 or 3 holes on handicap.

SENIORS CUP (1982)

Open to Members of 60 years and over. Those who will be 60 during the year may enter at any meeting which falls on or after her 60th Birthday.

This is awarded for the best Stableford score, the better of 2 scores or a single score to qualify. The player must state **before playing** that she is returning a card for the trophy, and the card and Competitors Sheet must be marked with an 'S' by the desk

As two or more courses may be involved, the player with the most points on the course with the higher SS will win. If there is a tie on 2 courses with the same SS the player with the lower handicap will win or, if necessary better inward half, last 6 or 3 holes. If there is a tie on the same course, the player with the better inward half will win, or if necessary, the last 6 or 3 holes.

VETERANS SALVER (The Taylor Tray – donated by Mrs. A. D. Taylor 1974)

Open to Members of 50 years and over on the day of play. This is awarded for the best NET score at the June or August Meeting. The player must state **before playing** that she is returning a card for the trophy, and the card and Competitors Sheet must be marked with a **'V'** at the desk.

SUMMER QUAICH (in memory of Dr. S. Tocher 1997)

The best Net score at the July Meeting.

AUTUMN CUP (1991)

The best Net score at the August / September Meeting.

SCRATCH/HANDICAP COMPETITIONS (Two Trophies donated 1997)

Scratch - Margaret Chalmers Handicap - Sheila Beattie Matchplay, knockout competitions played throughout the season. Scratch : Open to 0-12 handicap players, including Juniors

Handicap : Open to Silver Handicap players, including Juniors 0-12 handicap players eligible for both competitions. Final to be played over a neutral course. Full rules on separate sheet.

COMMONWEALTH SPOONS

SLGA Competition. Foursomes medal play on 1/2 combined handicap. One couple for every 10 entries qualify to play in the final (5 and over counts as 10).

SHEPHERD QUAICH

Each team consists of two couples. Method of play is foursomes on handicap (half difference between aggregate handicaps). The result is determined by the aggregate score of the two couples. Full rules on separate sheet given to each Team Captain. (Players with playing handicap 36 and under can take part.)

NB competitors must be members of the ALCGA prior to the closing date for entries for each competition.
